- State-level GHG reduction policy options (“catalog”)
 - Add or delete options as needed
- Develop design elements and characteristics of policy options
- Characterize policy options for CCAC approval; final report

Development of Policy Options

- Design Template / Matrix (see handout)
 - Policy description
 - Design (from design options matrix)
 - Potential implementation mechanisms
 - Related policies/programs in place
 - Type(s) of GHG reductions
 - Estimated GHG savings and cost per MTCO_{2e}
 - Key uncertainties
 - Types of additional (non-GHG) benefits and or costs
 - Description of feasibility issues, if needed
 - Status of group approval
 - Level of group support
 - Barriers to consensus

Reminder:

Nature of Cross Cutting TWG

- No underlying sectoral inventory, so the approach is different
- Seek to frame broader, policy-based approaches
- CC TWG is not...
 - A “catch-all” for policy options (e.g., “growth”)
 - To engineer program details

State-Level GHG Reduction Policy Options

- Add existing and new MT options as needed
- Identify priorities from catalog of state policy options (*see catalog handout*)
 - Rank and screen options as needed
 - Recommend initial priorities for further development to the CCAC
